Classroom Management Plan

I will be using Class Dojo as a way for me to keep track of the students' behavior. Your family can also keep track of how your child is doing during the day by creating an account using a specific connection sheet that I will give you and your child. This helps you link directly with your child's name and information. Each student can also sign up as well! They also have Class and Student Stories where you will be able to see pictures and information on what the class is doing as a whole, or what your child is doing individually. You can also use this to connect with me as well. As the students follow my expectations, go above and beyond, and act as role models for the school, I will reward them with points that they can use to spend in our class auctions throughout the year. Students who have the most points at the end of each week will get first priority in choosing an activity during our weekly Fun Friday celebration. If they do exceptionally well, they might even become the Student of the Week for the week that follows. There are specific things that they can do for each day that week. If I see a student showing exceptional character traits, I will give them a Warrior Way ticket. Warrior Way tickets can be used to purchase school wide rewards. These are used by all of the staff members as infinitives for the students.

Students who do not follow the standard operating procedures (SOP) will have natural consequences, may have silent lunch time or miss recess time. Depending on the severity/frequency of a behavior the consequences may result in a School Behavior Report to be completed and the student may or may not be in contact with the administration at this point.

Major Infractions that will automatically result in using a School Behavior Report:

- Not being safe (Towards oneself or another)
- Disrespectful/Defiant
- Destruction of Property
- Severe Bullying/Harassment
- Committing of any illegal activity

Classroom Assessment Policy

Classroom assessments will be used to monitor each student's progress toward academic goals, meet individual student needs, and drive the planning process for instruction. Assessment data in all subjects will also be used to improve instruction, inform program decisions, and communicate with families regarding student progress. I will be using a variety of assessments in my classroom. When I assess students, I will make sure that I:

- Assess the learning target
- Provide valid and appropriate demonstrations of what students should know and be able to do
- Provide information to drive further instruction
- Provide a variety of ways they can demonstrate learning, including options appropriate to preferred learning styles
- Provide meaningful feedback to students, including opportunities to reflect, self evaluate, set goals, and strengthen their performance
- Analyze and share data with the second grade team and school

I will be sure to make adjustments in instruction to meet the students' needs based on the results of these assessments. Here are just a few examples of assessments that I will be using throughout the year:

- Traditional pencil and paper quick checks, quizzes, and tests
- Digital assessment tools (GoFormative.com, Plickers, Educreations, ect.)
- Projects
- Anecdotal notes taken during class lessons, discussions, or activities

Proficiency Scales will be used to track how well the students understand the content for the year. You can access these scales at the Clark Pleasant website.

The goal is for the students to be at a 3.0 for every EL (Essential Learnings) by the end of the year. Grades will be given for each EL taught at the end of each quarter. You will see this on your child's report cards. We will be having remediation and enrichment tasks in place for students who are below and above this goal. You can track your child's progress of these scales online by going to the Clark Pleasant website, hitting the Parents dropdown menu, and selecting ParentVUE/StudentVUE.

Homework will be mandated when given. Certain requests like returning documents, data folders and signed planners help make the communication between families and me much stronger. Students will be rewarded with Dojo points to spend at our class auctions when they do these tasks. While doing these tasks, students will keep track of where they are for each EL, and they will set goals and devise plans to help them learn and grow throughout the year. If I feel a student needs extra practice on a particular piece of content, I will do everything I can to provide that child with the necessary resources to learn the material inside and outside of the classroom.

If a student still needs additional assistance, I am open to providing them with tutoring outside of school day at the family's expense. Families must provide transportation in order to arrange this.

Miscellaneous

Planners: This is a great communication tool and a daily record of classroom assignments. The students will record any behavior issues or homework in their planners.

Please check and sign it daily if your child has been having difficulty with turning things in or behavior.

Your child will also be responsible for writing the things

they need to do to help with remembering. I will only check the students' planners who are showing pitfalls in turning things in or having behavior issues within the classroom.

Daily Folders: Each child will have a Take Home Folder. They will put things that need to be returned to school in the RETURN side. If you have any notes, transportation changes, or anything else you need to send to school please put it in the RETURN side, so it can be turned in the following morning. All other papers including graded work, practice work, and notes from the office will be placed by the student on the KEEP side. Anything on the KEEP side needs to be emptied each night.

Make-up Work: If your child is absent, please contact me for the assignments by 12:00PM if you want to pick it up in the afternoon. This will allow me to gather the materials required for your child. Otherwise they will get it upon their return.

Parent Involvement: All parents volunteering for field trips or classroom activities will need to have a criminal background check. Please contact the front office for the paperwork. You will also need to attend a Parent Volunteer Meeting.

Newsletters: Newsletters will be sent both in electronic and hard format. You should expect one by Monday afternoon each week. Please read the newsletter, as it will keep you up to date on weekly news, skills we are working on, upcoming events, and other important school-wide information. I will also be posting them on my website as well.

Box Tops for Education: As your family goes to the store, keep your eyes peeled for those wonderful pink Box Tops that help to support learning in our school. A collection will be held four times throughout the school year.

Snacks: There will be a snack time built in our morning block to help keep the students' minds and bodies energized. Students may bring a small, healthy snack every day. Only PEANUT FREE snacks can be brought in. Keep in mind that these will not be refrigerated. Healthy snacks include, but are not limited to:

 Fresh or dried fruit, pretzels, breakfast bars, granola bars, Graham crackers, crackers and cheese, dry unsweetened cereal, String cheese, Popcorn, Fig Newtons, fresh vegetables, Goldfish crackers, Trail mix, Bagels, etc. Please no sugary snacks! Here is a list of foods that will **not** be permitted to eat within the classroom (With the exception of parties):

Candy, cookies, fruit roll-ups, chips, etc.

Students may also keep a water bottle at their desk. **Only** water will be permitted. If you would like to donate snacks to the classroom for students that forget to bring any, both myself and the class would greatly appreciate it.

Birthdays: Sugary treats will not be allowed within the classroom during birthdays. However, birthday treats can be given during lunch as long as they are store bought. Students can also have their names presented on the electronic sign out front by paying \$10.00 to the P.T.O.

Parties: Our class will have four parties during the school year; A Fall, Winter, and Valentine's Day Party. The parties will begin at 3:00PM. More information will be sent out prior to each party.
